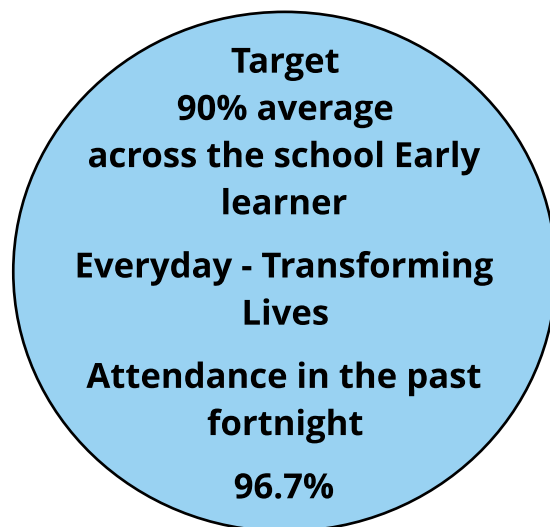

HOMEWORK POLICY

Some questions regarding the school's homework policy were raised by some parents during the Information Sessions last week. The following comes from our school's Homework Policy and gives clarity to the school's position.

Rationale

St Matthew's Homework Policy has been developed through consultation with parents, students and teachers. It takes into account the need for students and their families to have a balanced lifestyle. This includes sufficient time for family, recreation and cultural pursuits.

In line with the Department of Education and Community it is important to note that homework is not a compulsory activity. Homework that is set is given to reinforce concepts being taught in class. The responsibility for overseeing homework lies essentially with the parents. Homework should not be a cause of stress or upset for children or parents. The emphasis should always be placed on the learning value.

Aims

St Matthew's places great focus and energy on literacy and numeracy skills. We desire that our students:

- cultivate a passion for reading, becoming highly effective readers and seeing reading as a foundational skill to powerful learning; and
- acquire a love of Mathematics, becoming numerate learners by developing the knowledge and skills to use mathematics confidently across all areas of their lives.

Implementation

Homework is seen as valuable when it is undertaken in partnership between home and school and when it provides parents with an opportunity to be part of their child's formal learning. Homework practices aim to take account of the variety of family circumstances and the diversity of parent beliefs about homework. Whilst the staff of *St Matthew's* School will set homework activities and check them on a weekly basis there will be no punitive consequence for not completing set tasks. The completion of homework is at the discretion of parents and dictated by family circumstance. We do ask that if tasks are not completed that parents notify the class teachers by a note on the homework sheet or through another means of communication.

Homework will be given on Friday and returned to school the following Friday.

The quantity of homework needs to be manageable and takes into consideration:

- The age appropriateness for students
- Student's commitments for out of school hours activities such as sport, cultural activities, tuition and home responsibilities,
- Access to resources and technology beyond school, and
- Clearly communicated to each student.

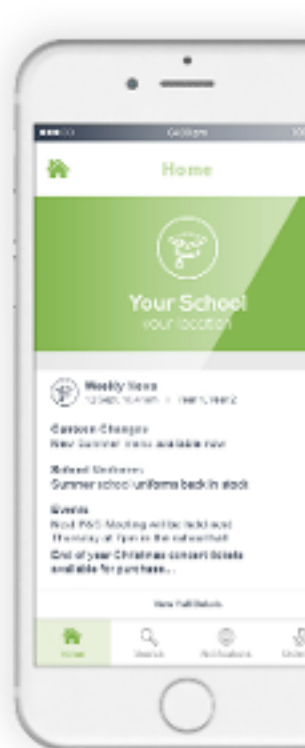

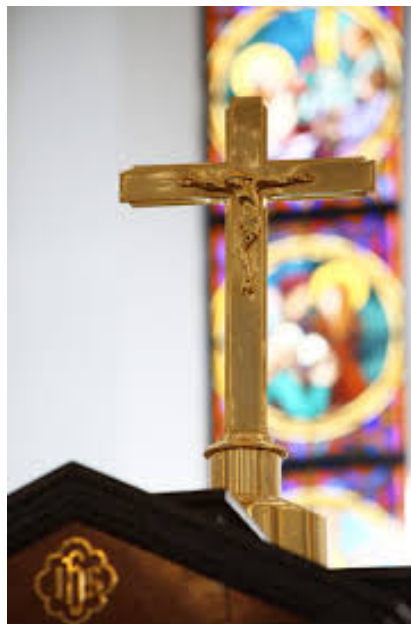

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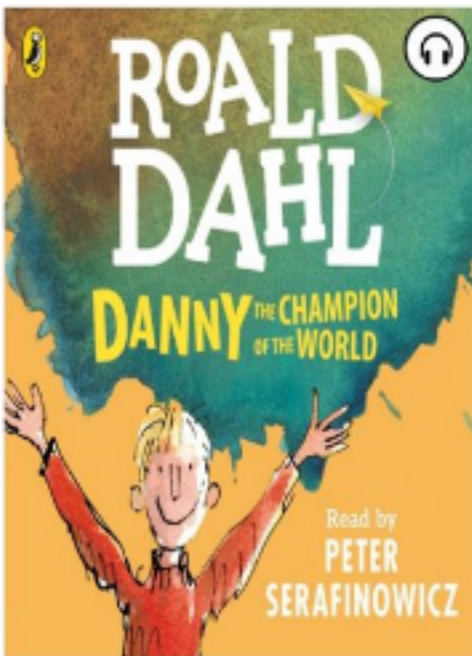

2019 Diocesan School Fees

Dear parents and carers

Please find below the Annual Diocesan fees schedule for 2019. The new schedule includes a very modest 2.7% increase on the fees from 2018.

School-based fees will also be limited to a 2.7% increase. School-based fees cover the costs of important things such as technology and school administration.

School fees are generally billed in instalments during Terms 1, 2 and 3. The fee is made up of three main parts:

1. Diocesan tuition fee

These are set by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta and are the same for every school. There are **significant sibling discounts** for families with more than one child at a Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta school (it does not have to be the same school).

Those discounts and a list of the annual Diocesan tuition fees for 2019 are outlined below.

2. Diocesan Building Levy

This fee is set by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta and is the same for every school. The annual Diocesan building levy for 2019 is \$804. **There is only one Diocesan building levy per family with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College, Kingswood** and it is billed in instalments over the first 3 terms of the year. A sibling discount of 50% is granted to families with children within the bordering Archdiocese of Sydney and Dioceses of Wollongong and Broken Bay.

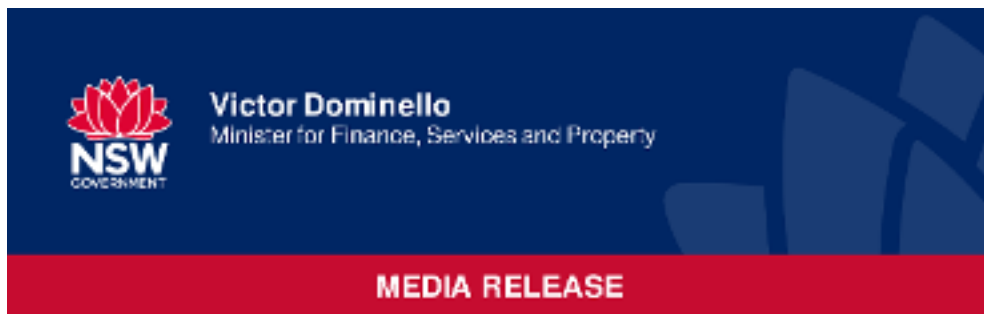
3. School-based fees

These are determined by the school according to the needs of that school and billable for each child. School-based fees are often called 'resource fees' or 'activity fees'. These fees help schools cover the costs of things like teaching resources, technology, excursions etc.

\$100 Creative Kids Vouchers Go Live

As parents begin planning for the year ahead, they can now access Creative Kids vouchers, providing them with \$100 for every school-age child to help cover the cost of enrolment for creative and cultural learning activities. Parents can use one voucher for every school-age child per year to help meet the cost of structured creative and cultural activities, such as music lessons, languages, coding, drama and theatre, photography and graphic design. Minister for Finance, Services and Property Victor Dominello said the NSW Government's Creative Kids program builds on the success of the Active Kids program, which is back this year, helping to reduce the cost of registration for sport and organised physical activity.

\$100 CREATIVE KIDS VOUCHERS GO LIVE

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Minister for Finance, Services and Property Victor Dominello said the NSW Government's Creative Kids program builds on the success of the Active Kids program, which is back this year, helping to reduce the cost of registration for sport and organised physical activity.

"The start of the school year is just around the corner and we are encouraging parents to get in early by jumping on the Service NSW website to register for their Creative Kids vouchers," Mr Dominello said.

"Involvement in creative and cultural learning activities is critical to a child's growth and development but the enrolment costs all add to the family budget and can be prohibitive.

"The NSW Government recognises that cost of living is a major issue for families and because of our strong budget position, we are proud to be providing this extra assistance for children to participate in these valuable creative and cultural programs.

"This program complements the hugely popular Active Kids voucher and for a family with two children, Creative and Active Kids combined will save you \$400 a year."
