Dear Parents and Caregivers,

This time last year Miss Keane, Miss Trefoni and Miss Cullen, along with myself were ending our time at World Youth Day in Krakow, Poland. Last Sunday a 12 month reunion of the pilgrimage group was held to recall, relive, reconnect and recommit to the learning that came from the experience of pilgrimage.

Just as our family gatherings allow us to we had the opportunity to recall the stories, places, events and people. To relive moments of joy, struggle, challenge and sadness. To reconnect with friends and colleagues to share what has happened in the past 12 months as a result of the pilgrimage experience. To recommit to continue the commitment to evangelising the Good News of the Gospel through words, thoughts and actions.

Feast of St Maximilian Kolbe

Monday of this week was the Feast Day of St Maximilian Kolbe. As part of the pilgrimage to Poland we visited the site of the Auschwitz death camp and read and heard the story of selfless love for others of this Church martyr. St. Maximilian Kolbe was born as Raymund Kolbe on January 8, 1894, Poland. He was a Polish Franciscan friar and a martyr in the German death camp of Auschwitz during World War II. Kolbe volunteered to take the place of a man who had family after he had been chosen to face death by starvation to warn against prisoners attempting to escape. St. Maximilian Kolbe died on August 14 and his remains were cremated on August 15, which is the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. This is very fitting as St Maximilian had a very strong devotion to Mary and her Immaculate Conception. He was a wonderful example to us all of the selfless love that reflects the words of Jesus 'love one another as I have loved you'.

In thinking about how respect towards each other is so important, I enjoyed the following reflection that gives 10 simple points to always remember. Why not take the time to share this with your child.

- 1. Speak to people. There is nothing as nice as a cheerful word of greeting.
- 2. Smile at people. It takes 72 muscles to frown and only 14 to smile.
- 3. Call people by name. The sweetest music to anyone's ear is the sound of their own name.
- 4. Be friendly and helpful. Be a friend to all.
- 5. Be cordial. Speak and act as if everything you do were a genuine pleasure.
- 6. Be genuinely interested in people. You can like everybody if you try.
- 7. Be generous with praise, cautious with criticism.
- 8. Be considerate of the feelings of others, it will be appreciated.
- 9. Be thoughtful of the opinions of others, there are always three sides to controversy yours, the other person's and the right one.
- 10.Be alert to give service. What counts most in life is what we do for others.

Dear God, you gave us in the person of St. Maximilian an example of true of unselfish love for our neighbor. Amidst the hate and lonely misery of Auschwitz, you brought love into the lives of fellow captives and sowed the seeds of hope amidst despair. Help us to become more like you, reaching out with love to the marginalised and outcast of our world. Amen.

In partnership let us continue to work to develop in the children strong minds and gentle hearts

Kiss & Drop/Parking in Little Church St

A meeting was held at the Council Chambers on Monday of this week to determine the future of the our Kiss and Drop zone. The outcome of the meeting was that this facility will continue, however, police have significant concerns with some driver behaviour. To avoid further difficulties with residents and the safety of all users it is important that those using the Kiss & Drop Zone and parking in Little Church St in the morning or afternoon:

- Keep all driveways clear
- * Comply with all traffic rules and regulations
- * Drive into the Kiss & Drop as far as possible
- * Avoid cueing don't angle in if you are next in line, instead
- * Drive around the block if the Zone if full
- * Wait until passengers are secured into their seats and the driver in front leaves before driving out

If Police patrols see parents in breach of rules and regulations they will issue infringement notices. Your assistance in following these rules will keep this facility open.

Greetings St Matthew's School Community!

Thank you to the two parents who attended the Religious Education Parent Information Meeting last Wednesday night. It was a wonderful night with information shared about how Religious Education is taught in the classroom. We discussed and explored the different ways our students are learning about their faith and making it real and meaningful to their lives and the community beyond. The students are using Scripture as the core reference to their learning through the Three Senses- Literal, Spiritual and Application. From this, they learn about God, Catholic Tradition, Catholic Values, Sacraments and how to apply these to their lives. Sharing your faith with your child is very important.

From Pope Francis-

Next, the family keeps the faith. Here too, we can ask: How do we keep our faith as a family? Do we keep it for ourselves, in our families, as a personal treasure like a bank account, or are we able to share it by our witness, by our acceptance of others, by our openness? We all know that families, especially young families, are often "racing" from one place to another, with lots to do. But did you ever think that this "racing" could also be the race of faith? Christian families are missionary families. ... They are missionary in everyday life, in their doing everyday things, as they bring to everything the salt and the leaven of faith! Keeping the faith in families and bringing to everyday things the salt and the leaven of faith.

HERB AND GARLIC SWEET POTATO CHIPS WITH YOGHURT DIP Ingredients

2 x 400g (medium) sweet potatoes

1 tsp dried rosemary leaves

1 clove garlic, crushed

2 tsp olive oil

Olive oil or canola cooking spray for greasing

Yoghurt dip

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup low fat plain Greek styled yoghurt

2 green shallots, thinly sliced

¹/₂ tsp ground cumin

2 tsp lemon juice

2 tsp chopped fresh dill

¹/₄ tsp ground white pepper

Method

- 1. Preheat over to 220C (fan-forced).
- 2. Wash unpeeled sweet potatoes under cold water. Dry with paper towel. Cut in half, then cut each half into approximately 3cm thick wedges.
- 3. Place wedges in a large bowl with rosemary, garlic and olive oil. Toss well with clean hands.
- 4. Spread wedges in a single layer over a greased oven tray. Cook in preheated oven for 20 minutes. Remove from oven. Turn wedges, then return to oven for a further 15-20 minutes, or until wedges are tender and well browned.
- 5. Meanwhile, to make yoghurt dip, combine yoghurt, shallots, cumin, lemon juice, dill and pepper.
- 6. Serve wedges with yoghurt dip.

Tasks for kids:

Toss wedges in a large bowl with rosemary, garlic and olive oil (Step 3).

Spread wedges over oven tray (Step 4).

Combine ingredients for yoghurt dip (Step 5).




As you know it is very important that children attend school every day. Quite often leave is requested by parents for various reasons. While we understand that this may be necessary sometimes, it is not encouraged as every school day is important for every child.

If you intend taking your child out of school for five days or more you must make a formal application in writing to the Principal and fill out an application for extended leave which is available from the school office.

It is important for you to know that, depending on circumstances, this leave may not be granted. Each application will be considered on an individual basis and could depend on circumstances such as the intention for the leave, your child's attendance, and the impact the leave may have on your child's academic progress.

These regulations are in place to make sure that your child achieves to his/her full potential and I know you will understand the reasoning behind them.


