NEW LEARNING SPACES

Last week I was informed by Mr Mark Holyoake that the School Provisioning Committee of the Parramatta Diocese, which approves all school building projects at the Catholic Education Office, has reviewed the proposed learning spaces planned for St Matthew's. The committee has decided to reduce the scope of the project to one learning space rather than the two spaces originally planned. There are a number of reasons for the reduction in the scope of the works including the need to develop a holistic plan for all

Hawkesbury Catholic schools with an eye to the impacts and demands that future development will have, the total number of enrolments projected for 2018 at St Matthew's, as well as the individual group sizes in each grade. Whilst this late decision is disappointing the provision of the additional space will allow for some future expansion whilst the holistic plan is in development. As this decision has been delayed the flow on will mean a delay in the completion of the project. It is now expected to be completed by the end of February. Year 3 will continue to share their learning with COSHC until the installation of the new space is completed. The new learning space will be used by Year 3 once completed. All other Year and Stage groups will continue to be in their current spaces.

In preparation for the 2018 school year, I would like to inform you of some important information, key events and initiatives that have been planned for 2018.

Mathematics Assessment Interviews MAI Screening

MAIs will be conducted on Monday 29th & Tuesday 30th January. The information that will be gathered from these interviews is extremely valuable to teachers in knowing where to begin the teaching process to maximize learning for all students. There have been questions about the timing of these assessments from some parents. The Growth Point Framework is based on each child's mathematical understanding at the **beginning** of each school year. To conduct these assessments at any other time during the school year would mean that we do not gather accurate assessment information. Also by completing the MAIs before formal lessons begin the interruption to learning and classroom routines at the beginning of the year is minimised.

First Day For All Students

All students will begin the new school year on Wednesday 31st January. Students in Yrs 1-6 will begin with a whole school assembly under the COLA at 9am. All beginning Kinders will meet with their parents and teachers in the Hall from 9:15 for a Welcome Prayer. After the children leave for the first day there will be a Tissues, Tears and Tea for the parents.

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Canteen Operations in 2018

In our Week 7 Newsletter we advised that the canteen operator and the days of operation have changed. The new operator is Tuckshop 2 U which is a mobile canteen service. The operating days will be Monday & Friday. Tuckshop 2 U offers a full food service and can provide both lunch and afternoon recess. It is hoped that with an increase in demand we will be able to build the days back to the canteen being open for the full week.

Since this announcement we have looked at alternatives for how we can provide a limited service to the students on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Starting in Week 2 of Term 1 we will have a stand that will sell a limited range of items including drinks (juice and water), ice blocks and ice creams as well as a small range of snacks. There will be no lunches available from this stall and there will be no need to pre-order. We are also looking to have special lunch days during each term.

Opening School Mass - Our opening school mass will be at 9:30 a.m. on Friday 16th February. At this celebration, our Year 6 SRC and Sports Captains will receive their leadership badges and our new Kindergartens will be formally welcomed to our school community. All parents are warmly invited.

Welcome BBQ- will be held on Friday 9th February from 5:00-8:00 pm. More information will follow in the first week of 2018.

<u>Sports Uniform</u> - All students will wear their sports uniform on two days in the week. All students will wear their sports uniform on Wednesday and one other day in the week which will be the day for their PE lesson. The days for each Learning Group is listed in the table below:

<u>Monday Morning Assembly</u> – Each Monday we will continue to gather as a school to begin our week with a short assembly. At this assembly, our Year 6 SRC lead the school in prayer and share the important events of the week ahead. We invite parents to join us at the morning gathering.

<u>School Assembly</u> - In 2018 school assemblies will continue in the same way as 2017. Primary assemblies will be in even weeks, Infants in the odd weeks. The first school assembly will be held in Term 1 Week 4 with a Primary assembly. Please note there will be no school assembly on the first Monday of each term.

Parent Information Evening - will be held on Wednesday 7th February starting at 7pm. We will gather in the hall to begin the evening and then move to learning spaces for specific grade information. There will be two sessions held on this evening, the second being a repeat of the first, this is to allow parents with children in multiple stages to attend. Teachers will have an information sheet to share with you at these meetings, if you are unable to attend please ensure that your child picks up this information.

<u>Ash Wednesday/Lent/Holy Week/ Easter Celebrations.</u> - Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, 14th February. As part of our preparations for the Lenten season we will celebrate Shrove Tuesday (Pancake Tuesday) as well as have a ceremony for preparing the ashes for Ash Wednesday.

<u>Catholic Schools Week</u> - this annual celebration of Catholic Schooling will be from the 4th-10th March. There will be a variety of activities during the week.

Easter - 30th March - 2 April, inclusive of these days.

Other Important Matters

Regular Attendance - Every Learner Every Day

Once again in 2018 student attendance at school will be a major focus. Daily attendance at school is the most certain way to ensure that children achieve to the best of their ability. In 2017 we were able to increase average daily attendance to 87%. In 2018 the Every Learner Every Day campaign aims to have a minimum average of 90% daily attendance for all children. To achieve this the single most important factor is continued parent commitment to have your children at school each day before school starts. There will be regular reminders about attendance as well as the level of attendance for the previous fortnight in our newsletters, follow up on unexplained absences and extended periods of absence which have not been approved as well as recognising students who have achieved high levels of regular attendance. To start this initiative included with this letter are some simple statistics regarding the impact of regularly missing small periods of time. We look forward to working with all families in achieving this goal.

Library – Our school Library will be open each Thursday for borrowing and to provide our Stage 1 and Stage 3 teachers with part of their release for planning. The library will be open for borrowing in Week 3 on Thursday 8th February. Times for borrowing will be organized early in Term 1 and will be shared at the parent information evening. The Library will also be open each lunch for those children who wish to have an alternative to the playground.

<u>Newsletters</u> - In 2018 the Newsletter day will continue to be shared on **Thursday** of the odd weeks of the term. Most notes will also be sent home on this day. This is to ensure that all communications, as far as possible, go home on the day of publication and are not missed. There will be, on occasion, the need to send home notes on other days, however, Thursday will be the main day for notes to go home.

School Fees

There will be a change to the way that school fees are billed in 2018. Presently school fees are billed by term but from 2018 fees will be billed by instalments. There will continue to be 3 billing instalments in the year those dates will be 29th January to 17th May 2018, 18th May to 3rd September 2018 and the final instalment is 4th September to 21st December. All current payment options will be available in 2018. If you wish to discuss any matter related to school fees, please make a time to speak with Mrs Roberts and myself.

School Banking

In 2018 school banking, will be on Wednesday of each week.

Extra Curricula Partnerships






