PLAYGROUND UPGRADES

During the holidays it is planned that a new air-conditioning unit will be installed in the COSHC space. Over the coming months there are also plans to upgrade the playground. Final specifications and quotes are being considered in relation the installation of more artificial/synthetic grass in the playground so that the play areas for the children are improved and made safer. This may involve the relocation of the Mary Garden, all plants and shrubs will be relocated and replanted in a more suitable area of the playground. The student toilet blocks will also be undergoing a refurbishment during the year. We will keep everyone updated as we have more specific information related to proposed starting dates and the scope of work involved.




